Part 1: Foundations of Hebrew Literacy Coaching (1 session)

1. Welcome and introductions: Establish a supportive coaching environment.
2. Hebrew literacy landscape: Discuss current challenges and trends in Hebrew literacy education, reviewing thoughts, feelings, and questions from the introductory course and current knowledge.
3. Coaching objectives and expectations: Review current practice, set clear goals, and establish a plan to meet the needs of diverse learners.
4. Plan a case study: Prepare to sketch out learner profiles and explore methods for assessing student Hebrew literacy skills.

Part 2: Understanding Student Needs and Learning Profiles

(1-2 sessions)

1. Review, analyze, and interpret student assessments and data.
2. Sketch a learner's profile, identifying their zone of proximal development for phonology, orthography, vocabulary, comprehension, fluency, and other instructional needs and interests.
3. Plan an intervention that is feasible, targeted, enjoyable using Hebrew Scouts (and existing) curricula in a comprehensive and targeted way.
4. Implement error correction procedures.
5. Conduct progress monitoring.

Part 3: Effective Instructional Strategies and Sustainability

(1-2 sessions)

1. Review intervention, progress monitoring data, identify additional areas of need.
2. Explore further strategies for supporting students with dyslexia, language, learning and attention differences.
3. Implement phonemic awareness and decoding strategies.
4. Develop and apply vocabulary instruction and comprehension methods.
5. Practice and enhance fluency and reading aloud techniques.
6. Engage in self-reflection, celebrate measurable progress, explore sustainability, and further areas for growth.
