

Part 1: Establishing Rapport & Assessing Student Needs

- Welcome & Introductions Build a supportive coaching environment.
- Hebrew Literacy Landscape Explore key challenges and trends reflecting on prior knowledge, school expectations and insights from the introductory course.
- Coaching Goals & Expectations Assess current practices, set clear objectives, and create a plan to meet the needs of all students.
- Gathering Student Data Conduct assessments and review existing data to understand individual and classwide learning profiles.

Part 2: Interpreting Data & Structuring the Learning Environment

- Identifying Student & Class Learning Needs Determine zones of proximal development across phonology, orthography, vocabulary, comprehension, and fluency.
- Creating Flexible Student Groups Use assessment results to form flexible instructional groups. Partner with the school, tutors, and parents to support struggling students.
- **Planning for Long-Term Growth** Predict annual student progress and plan instruction that fosters steady development.
- Selecting & Securing Instructional Materials Align resources with student needs, teacher styles, and school expectations.
- Setting Up the Classroom Establish space and routines that balance:
 - Teacher-Led Instruction ("I Do") Whole-class mini lessons.
 - Guided Practice & Feedback ("We Do") Small-group and oneon-one support.
 - Independent & Partner Work ("You Do") Literacy centers, shelf works, home learning for independent practice.

Part 3: Effective Classroom Instruction (1-2 sessions)

- Delivering Targeted Instruction Use Hebrew Scouts and other curricula to design engaging, differentiated lessons aligned with students' zones of proximal development.
- Implementing Error Correction Strategies Apply research-backed techniques to support student learning and reinforce literacy skills.
- Incorporate thematic and implicit literacy learning experiences that are relevent, meaningful and targeted

Part 4: Progress Monitoring & Sustainable Practices (1-2 sessions)

- Monitoring & Adjusting Instruction Regularly assess progress, refine student groupings, and adjust instruction based on data.
- Supporting Diverse Learners Differentiate instruction for students with learning differences, strengthening phonemic awareness, decoding, vocabulary, comprehension and fluency.
- Ensuring Sustainability & Communication Reflect on progress, celebrate achievements, and plan for long-term success. Partner with the schools, tutors and parents to support struggling students.
